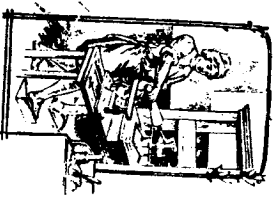

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PREFACE

Henry Winthrop Hardon (1861-1934) was born in Boston and was a successful lawyer in New York City until his death. However, it is through his avocation of genealogy that he is best remembered today. The New Hampshire Historical Society has six published and twenty-eight unpublished genealogies by him, on such families as Cole, Huckins, Lord, Peverly and Roberts. Because of their high standards of scholarship and extensive use of primary sources, Hardon's works continue to be used extensively.

As Hardon explains in his "Introduction," the basis for *Newington Families* was Rev. Joseph Adams' record of marriages and baptisms, dating from 1716 to 1783. These Hardon rearranged by family, and then made numerous additions, from such sources as the *New England Historical and Genealogical Register*, various volumes of the *New Hampshire State Papers* and published genealogies. For some families the entries are brief - perhaps just a few marriages or baptisms. But for many, the treatment is so lengthy that it amounts to a genealogy in itself. Among these are the families of Adams, Ayres, Bickford, Fabyan, Furber, Nutter, Peavey, Pickering, Place, Shackford, Trickey and Walker.

The Town of Newington borders on the north and west of Portsmouth, in the southeast part of New Hampshire. Originally a part of Dover called Bloody Point, it was separated as a town in its own right in 1713. Being so close to the earliest settlements in New Hampshire, Newington is an important town for anyone doing research into 17th and 18th-century New Hampshire. However, no published history of Newington includes genealogies.

The New Hampshire Historical Society is pleased to make its original manuscript of *Newington Families* available to a wider audience. We hope that by publications such as this, we will continue our mission of communicating the values of New Hampshire history to everyone.
