From MONDAY June 19, to MONDAY June 26. 1732.

On Saturday laſt in the Afternoon arriv'd here Capt. Moverley, in about Eleven Weeks from London, by whom we have the following Advices, viz.

Amſterdam, April 14.

IT is adviſed from Seville, of the 21ſt paſt, that they continue to lay an Embargo on ſuch Ships as are fit for Transporting Troops for the Expedition, which is ſtill kept a Secret, but it was believed would ſoon be cleared up, ſince the Fleet would probably put to Sea in 3 or 4 Weeks time. They reckon the Expence of the laid Ships will be 150 000 Crowns per Month.

From Vienna of the 2d Inſtant, That the Emperor had ſignified to the Chancellor of Hungary, that he had appointed the Duke of Lorraine Viceroy of that Kingdom, in Expectation that the Services of his Grandfather and Father would render him moſt acceptable to the States, ſome of which were gone to Breſlaw, to compliment that Prince.

From Ratiſbon of the 7th, that 1500 more Saltzburgh Proteſtants were arriv'd at Kaufbeuren, moſt of whom are taken Care of by a Pruſſian Commiſſary, who has Orders to ſupply them with Money, and all other Neceſſaries, to carry them to Pruſſia, to ſettle there.

LONDON, April 8.

On Thursday Night laſt was interr'd the Body of the Lady Humphreys, late Wife of Sir William Humphreys, Bart. one of the Aldermen of this City (from his Seat at Jenkins in Eſſex) at the Pariſh Church of St. Swithen's, London, in a very handſome Manner. She has left an only Daughter by her former Husband, Col. Robert Lancaſhire, who married Orlando Humphreys, Eſq; only Son of Sir William Humphreys: By her Death he is entitled to a conſiderable Eſtate. She was a moſt pious, worthy, good Lady, and much lamented by all that knew her.

Yeſterday a Board of Admiralty was held at the Admiralty Office, when their Lordſhips were pleaſed to put his Maſtety's Ship the Torrington, a Fifth Rate of 40 Guns, in Commiſſion, and appoint Capt. Wingate Commander of the ſame, and ---- Barber Eſq; one of the Lieutenants.

Brittol, April 5. The Gallant Enterpriſe, Cumby, is arriv'd here from Oporto, which place ſhe left in Company with Captains Barker, Hooper, Waters, and two or three more for England. She brings Letters dated the 31ſt paſt, N S. adviſing, That the Beckenham, Capt. Mathew Rooke, bound from London to Oporto, with Pipe Staves, Iron Hoops, 3 or 4 Bales, and a few other Goods, was loſt on the Bar going in, and beat to pieces; great part of her Cargo, ſome of her Rigging, and all her Crew were ſaved: They add, that ſince the Arrival of their Ships from Brazil, Soldiers were ſent on Board them as Guards; no Boats were ſuffer'd to go near them, nor any Perſon to come from them that did not firſt go to the Cuſtom Houſe to be ſearched. BOSTON, June 22.

From the Journal of the Hon. Houſe of Representatives. Jovis, Die 15. Junij, 1732.

A Meſſage from His Excellency by Mr. Secretary in the following Words, viz.

Gentlemen of the Houſe of Representatives,

I Am ſurpriz'd that you ſhould (after my repeated Denials) attempt a Bill for ſupply of the Treafury in the manner you have, and the more ſo, ſince your Agent writes you he has done All in his Power to get ſome Abatement on the Kings Inſtruction, and yet is oblig'd to ſay to you upon the whole,

I am very clear in the Impoſſibility of bringing our Court into the Allowance of your requeſt about ſupplying the Treafury.

You may, (Gentlemen) reſt aſſur'd, I can by no means give my Aſſent to the Bill you have now propos'd or to any other of ſuch a Nature.

Mr. Gee. Mr. Gee began with Prayer, Mr. Mather preach'd from 2 Cor. 5. 20. Now then we are Ambaſſadors for Chriſt, as though God did beſeech you by us: we pray you in Chriſt's ſtead, be ye reconcil'd to God. After Sermon the Rev. Dr. Sewall pray'd & Then the Rev. Dr. Colman gave the Charge, and the Rev. Mr. Cheever the Right Hand of Fellowſhip.

We are inform'd from Exeter that on Tueſday the 13th Inſt. two Lads of about 13 years of Age, went out in order to kill ſome Birds, & took their Guns with them one of the Lads name was Samuel Scribner, the other William Levit; and while purſuing their Game Scribner's Flint fell out of his Gun, and in putting it in again he kill'd his Companion Levit, the Shot went in at his left Shoulder and carry'd all the back part of his Head away, and he never ſpoke one word after. 'Tis remarkable, that this Samuel Scribner's Father was kill'd after the ſame manner a bout a Year ago.
