

Deacon Samuel Bass 1st, b. England, 1600, d. Bar 230 Dec. Braintree, Mass., 1694, m. Eng. Ann Shill, b. 1600, d. Bar 301 Braintree. Nothing is known of the English Ancestry, but in the Colonial Records the name is spelled Basse.

Deacon Samuel and wife Ann, with several children, came from England to Roxbury in 1632, and there were members of Rev. John Elliott's Church. In 1640 he removed to Braintree (now part of Quincy) and at once took an important place in the matters of the Town, both Religious and Political. This is shown by the Rec. of the Town Clerk, who departing from his usual brief obituaries, notices him as follows:

Deacon Samuel Bass, aged 94, departed this life upon the 30th day of December 1694, who had bin a Decon of the Church of Braintree for the space of 50 years, and was the father and grandfather and great grandfather of a hundred and sixty and two children before he died, the youngest whereof was Benimin Bas the son of Joseph Bas and Mary his wife, born seven days before his death. He represented the town in no less than twelve General Courts, served on important Committees, was Selectman innumerable times and active in the Church and all the time continued his farming."


Deacon Samuel's will, is so quaint, that I quote from it in part.
"In the name of God Amen

May 11th 1694, I Samuel Bass of Braintry being but infirm of body but sound in my understanding and memory and not knowing how soon or suddenly the Lord may please to call me out of this world and in consideration of my great change hastening upon me I do therefore make constitute and dictate this my last Will and testament. First;—I give my soul to God, through Jesus Christ my alone Savior with whom I hope to have had Communion with in my life and I hope he will not forsake me in death, and I desire to rely alone upon the mercy of God through merits of my alone Lord and Savior Jesus Christ my dear Redeemer.


Second; I give my son John ten acres of Salt Marsh and a wood lot in Captain's plain already set out to him and the Malt houses and the orchard before the malt houses, also half the well and half the kitchen, also some land in the stony field he hath in his possession, also a quarter part of my upland in the farm after Legacies to my two daughters is paid Mary Capen and Sarah Pennimen, and if there be any marsh land after the ten acres apiece to my three sons is taken out—if there be any overplus, I give it to my son John Bass.

Third; I give my son Joseph ten acres of Salt Marsh (which I value at 100 pounds). I give him the house he liveth in and the orchard on the back side of it, and the fresh meadow at the East. I give him the feather bed which he lyeth on and all the furniture and bedstead belonging to it (all of which I value at 100 pounds). I give him my barns and two acres

of ground my barns standeth on; reserving liberty for yard room and passage for my son John to his barns. I give Joseph half my kitchen and half my well and I give him 7 acres of land in stony field where my cows use to pasture and a wood lot in the Captain's plain."

Fourth; I give my son Thomas Bass ten acres of Salt Marsh and a wood-lot in Captain's plain already laid out to him also a quarter part of the uplands at the farm after the legacies above specified is paid.

Fifth; I give my daughter Mary Capen 40 pounds and my daughter Sarah Pennimen 20 pounds to be paid out of the uplands at the farm or otherwise be content, also my daughters Capen and Pennimen 5 cows. My meaning is in that expression of my will that the 40 pounds and three I have given to my daughter Mary Capen should be to her and her heirs forever. My will is that it is to be accounted as my son John Capen's estate and shall be equally divided among his children."

Deac. Samuel left bequests to several grandchildren and all taken from Joseph's estate (Joseph unmarried) and all so quaintly worded. 'Out of Joseph's estate except he have children or have need to spend it, all this given after my son Joseph Basses Decease".

Deac. Samuel owned 166 acres of Land in or near Braintree. Some items from the inventory of his estate.

His numerous progeny intermarried with all the early Braintree families; the Thayers, Paines, Adams, Faxons and Wales—Perhaps the most illustrious marriage regarded from the standpoint of today, was the marriage of his son John to Ruth Alden, daughter of John Alden and Priscilla Mullins of the Mayflower; and their daughter Hannah Bass married in turn into the Adams' family, a descendant of Henry Adams 1st, ancestor of the two Presidents Adams.

Right in the centre of the town of Braintree is the lovely ivy-covered church, founded in 1632, first church building 1639, present church 1828. Of this church, Samuel Basse was Deacon Basse from 1640 to 1694. The Silver "Communion Cup", his gift to the Church, is still one of the church's cherished possessions. Across the way is the little churchyard; and here after 50 years of Service, lie Deacon Samuel Bass and his "Goode wife Ann".

On a sunny afternoon 1928, Frank Bass' picture was taken between the low grey stones brought from England. Frank Bass beside Deacon Samuel—the first and ninth generations.

In the History of Dorchester, published in 1852 by the Dorchester Antiquarian Society are the following love letters of John Capen to Mary, sent for safety to her father.

To his Loueing and kind ffreind Goodman Bass, Deacon of the church at Brantrey, give this I pray you.

SIR,

My kind love and respect to you with yo' wife remembered, with thanks for all yo' kindness showed vnto me, hoping for yo' health and prosperity as my one. The Cause of my writtinge to you at this time, is only this, to make bold with you to be as a Cloake to cover this my inclosed letter directed to yo' daughter, because as yet I know not who may be the bearer heerof, I would intreate you to delieur it vnto her. Y' Contents of it I know she will not hide it from you. Therefore I doe forbeare it my selfe, because I shouse rather breauely but I would intreat her to keep it as private as she can from others. Thus in hast I rest, desiring yo' earnest prayers to god for vs for direction in this greate vndertakeing.

SWEETE-HARTE,

My kind loue and affection to you remembered; haueinge not as convenient opertunety to see and speake with you soe oft as I could desier, I therfore make bold to take opertunety as occasione offers it selfe to visset you win my letter, desiering y' it may find acceptance wth you, as a token of my loue to you; as I can assuer you y' yours have found from me; for as I came home from you ye other day, by ye way I reseaued your letter from your faithfull messenger, we was welcom vnto me, and for wth I kindly thank you, and do desier yt as it is ye first: so y' it may not be y' last, but y' it may be as a seed web will bring forth more frute: and for your good counsell and aduise in your letter specefied, I doe accept, and do desier y' we may still commend y casse to god, for direction and cleering vp of our way as I hope wee haue hethertoo done; and y' our long considerations may at ye next time bring forth firme conclussions, I meane verbally though not formally. Sweetharte I haue given you a large ensample of patience, I hope you will learne this instruction from y same, namely, to show ye like toward me if euer occassion be offered for futuer time, and for ye present, condesendency vnto my request;

thus wth my kind loue remembered to yo' father and mother and Brothers and sisters wth thanks for all ther kindnes wth haue been vndeserueing in me I rest, leaueing both them and vs vnto y^e protection and wise direction of y^e almighty.

My mother remembers her loue vnto yo' father and mother;

To his Deare and Loueing and Much respected ffreind Mary Bass, at hir fathers house in Brantrey, give this I pray speed.

SWEET-HART,

My kind loue and intiere affections to you remembred wth my respect vnto yo' father and mother and loue to yo' Brothers and sisters, hopeing of yo' health as I am at this time blessed by god. Ye cause of my writting to you at this time is to give you to vnderstand y' Sister Weld sent me word y' last night y' she had some stufs come to her hand, and this day I went thether of purpose to see them, y' soe I may send you word; now she have 3 peeces of stuf, but I think y' ther is but one of them y' you would like for yo self. It is a pretty sad stuf, but it have a thred of whit in it: it is 3 quarters broad and ye priz is 5' 6d ye yard. I was hopeing to speake wth father hear to day, but he was gon a little before I came home: alsoe whill I was with you at Brantrey Sister Swift being at Boston win Sister Vpsall they boath being at ye hatters shop did thinke vppon you for a hat and chose out ye comlyest fashon hatt y' they could find: (avoiding fantastick fashons) and caused ye man to set it by vntell this first day thinking we should speake wth some of you this day. Yo hat was a demecaster, the priz was 24'; ye shop was ye corner shop over against Mr Coggings on ye right hand as on goe up to M' Cottens house. It was set by win my name vpon it written on a paper: these things I thought good to aquaint you wth. You may consider of it and doe as you shall thinke good. I cannot be long, because I would faine send this letter to you this night if ther come by any messenger. I am now in good health againe, thanks be to god, and able if opertunety did serue to ride or goe wth you either to Waymouth or Boston to yo' wedding. Thus in hast I rest, leaueing you to ye protection of ye almighty. I could be glad to hear a few lines from you if opertunety of a messenger did serue.

John was a wheelright and maltster. His will was made 25 June, 1716, and proved 22 Oct. 1716.

On the very day it was proved, Joseph Bass, and Ephraim Thayer, son-in-law, "Humbly pray the Will of their late father may not be proved for the following reasons, that he was under great insanity at the time of making his Will, and Benjamin Webb a witness, declared that he had acted childish; that he was unduly influenced by his eldest son John³ and his grandson John⁴; and had given his widow but one-fourth instead of one-third, and other reasons." But their objections were fruitless and the Will was Proved that very day. Samuel Sewell wrote in his Diary referring to the Will of John Bass, "The new lawyer, Robert Auchmerty said, "They that opos'd, only delay'd without bringing any proof, though time was allowed them for that purpose." Three of John's children married children of Joseph Adams.

The printed Braintree V. R. give her as Ruth Ball, but in the original record it reads Ruth Bass. Ruth is not included in the list of Deac. Samuel's children, but is proved to be, quite conclusively—First, because at that early date there seems to be no Basses in Braintree or the vicinity, except the family of Deac. Samuel. Secondly, both Deac. Samuel and his son Joseph leave bequests to Hannah Walsbee. Third, because in 1694, Deac. Samuel, Roger Billings and David Walsbee, gave a Silver Communion Cup to Church. David Walsbee, Walsbie or Walsby, was married 1st to Hannah Manning who died 9 Feb. 1655 and he married Ruth Bass in 1656. Joseph Bass in his Will 1710, says:

"I give and bequeath to Hannah Walesby the Library and use of the South end of my dwelling house while she lives unmarried. I also give her One Cow to be well maintained summer and winter, and yearly one barrel of Cider and what apples she has occasion for her own spending; and find her constantly with firewood while she lives in my house. If she goes away or marriys pay her Five Pounds, and give her a bed and bedstead, my Great Kettle and Iron Pot." There has been discussion pro and con as to whether Ruth was Deac. Samuel's daughter, two present day Genealogists think she might have been a niece or younger sister, but this seems improbable. The names on the Silver Communion Cup, were the same names as men who had married Deac. Samuel's shildren or grandchildren. In Vol. 52, year 1898/9 of the N. E. Genealogical and Historic Reg. of Boston, Mrs. Alden, who had made a long study of the family and was related, states, "This Ruth who married David Walsbee was the sister of John Bass² and daughter of Deac. Samuel." The Thayer Memorial puts her as daughter of John², but John's daughter Ruth, m. Peter Webb.

John's Will at Braintree, 10 July 1723, is long and minute in every detail, he being most punctilious to give what came from his first wife Abigail Adams, to her sons John and Samuel; and to Ebenezer what came from his mother Rebecca Savil. Unlike most Colonial Fathers, he does not cut off his wife Rebecca if she remarries. Excerpts from his Will. "I give to Rebecca my well beloved wife, to be enjoyed by her during her natural life, that end of my dwelling house next to the street, with the dairy-room, also 1/4 of the lands which my father left me by Will. I give to her and my son Ebenezer after her decease, my best feather-bed and furniture, and one pair of woolen blankets, two pair of cotton and linen sheets, moreover an Iron Kettle, a new Brass Skillet and a warming-pan, four chairs she brought with her, her chest and new table, all earthen and glass weare; all peuter not brought with my former wife, one silver spoone, all spinning wheels for Woolen and Linen and utensils used in spinning.

That my sons viz. Samuel and Ebenezer, do provide for her each of them (yearly and every year) five bushels of Indian Corne, three bushels of Rye, Ten shillings of Beef, four Pounds of sheepswoll and three pounds of flax. Each of 'em Two cords of wood and apples which she needs for her use, one Cow to be at her owne disposal and one bushel of malt, with all money or Silver weare which I shall leave at my Decease I give to her and my Son Ebenezer after her Decease." John, when but 17 years old in 1675 was in King Philip's War, as we find "John Bass was paid 9 shillings for his services at Puckapaug."
