Bartholomew Whittum of York in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts (being sixty two years of age) depose and say, that in the Fall of 1775 or early in January 1776, I enlisted as a Private, on the Continental Establishment, in the late Revolutionary War, in the Company commanded by Captain Samuel Deby, and in the month of January aforesaid the said Company, and myself, joined the Regiment commanded by Colonel Penot, and I served in said Company for twelve months from January aforesaid when I was honorably discharged.

And I further depose and say that Jonathan Farnham of York enlisted at the time I did in said Company, and served as a good Soldier during the twelve months for which we enlisted, and was then honorably discharged, as I then was informed, and now believe.

And I further depose that said Farnham was then (at the time of enlistment) well known to me, and has so been ever since and that he is in need of his Country's aid for support.
