The furthest back named ancestor is Sebastien Jahan, born abt 1600 in Blois, Loir-et-Cher, France. The Laviolette part was given to men, mostly military men, and is associated with some 30+ other sumames. I guess it is similar to calling someone a pansy nowadays.
