5. **SIR JOHN de GREY, K.G.**, of Rotherfield, b. 9 Oct. 1300, d. 1 Sept. 1359, 1st Lord Grey of Rotherfield, K.G., 23 Apr. 1349; m. (1) by 1 Mar. 1311/12, Catharine, dau. and h. of Sir Bryan fitz Alan; m. (2) Avice, dau. of Sir John Marmion, Lord Marmion. (CP VI, 145-6).

9. **ALICE HARCOURT**; m. William Bessiles, of Sessiles-Leigh, co. Berks, d. 1515.

10. **ELIZABETH BESSILES**; m. Richard Fettiplace, of East Shelford, co. Berks, d. 1511.

11. **ANNE FETTIPLACE**, b. Shelford Parva, 16 July 1496, d. 3 Aug. 1567; m. Edward Purefoy, of Shalston, co. Buckingham, d. 13 Jan. 1494, d. 1558.

12. **MARY PUREFOY**, of Yardley-Hastings, co. Northampton; m. Thomas Thorne, gent., of Yardley-Hastings, d. 1589.

13. **SUSANNA THORNE**, bp. Yardley-Hastings, 5 Mar. 1559/60, liv. 29 Oct. 1588; m. **CAPTAIN ROGER DUDLEY** (149B-15), d. 1585.

14. **GOVERNOR THOMAS DUDLEY**, bp. Yardley-Hastings, 12 Oct. 1576, bur. Roxbury, Massachusetts, 31 July 1653, aged 76 years; Governor and Deputy-Governor of Massachusetts, 1630-1653; m. (1) Hardingstone, near Northampton, 25 Apr. 1603, Dorothy York, bur. Roxbury, 27 Dec. 1643, dau. of Edmund Yorke of Cotton End, co. Northampton; m. (2) Roxbury, 14 Apr. 1644, **KATHERINE (DEIGHTON) HACKBURNE** (28-17), q.v. (Children by the first wife: **REV. SAMUEL DUDLEY**, bp. 30 Nov. 1608; minister at Exeter, New Hampshire; **ANNE DUDLEY**, b. c. 1612, poet; m. 1628, Governor Simon Bradstreet of Massachusetts; **MERCY DUDLEY**, b. 1621; m. 1639, the Rev. John Woodbridge of Andover and Newbury, Mass.; **PATIENCE DUDLEY**, m. 1632, Maj.-Gen. Daniel Denison of Roxbury; **SARAH DUDLEY**, bp. 1620; m. (1) Maj. Benjamin Keayne; m. (2) 1649, Thomas Pacey. 3. ROBERT FITZ ROGER (44-3); m. 1265, Margery de la Zouche.

4. JOHN FITZ ROBERT, afterwards de Clavering (which name he assumed), of Costessey, Norfolk, b. c. 1266, ae 44+ in 1299, d.s.p.m. Aynhoe bef. 23 Jan. 1331/2; summoned to Parliament during the life of his father as Lord Clavering; m. 1278, Hawise, d. bef. 14 Apr. 1345, dau. of Robert de Tibetot, a crusader. (*CP* III, 275; XII (2), 89-93).

5. EVE de CLAVERING, Baroness Clavering, ae 40+ at mother's death, d. c. 1369, bur. at Langley Abbey, Norfolk; m. (2) bef. 2 Dec. 1308, Sir Thomas de Ufford, b. bef. 1286, said to have been slain at Bannockburn, 24 June 1314, bur. at Langley Abbey, Norfolk. (*CP* III, 275-6; IX, 498, note a; XII (2). 154).

6. EDMUND de UFFORD, Lord Clavering, 2nd but only surviving son, d. betw. 1 Sept. and 3 Oct. 1374 (yr. bro. of John de Ufford, Lord Ufford, d.s.p.m. 1361); m. Sibia, dau. of Sir Simon de Pierpont. (*CP* XII (2), 164-156, note f; *Sussex Archaeological Collections*, XI: 87).

7. ELA de UFFORD, bur. Ingham Priory, 1425; m. Sir Miles de Stapleton, b. c. 23 June 1357, d. 10 Apr. 1419, of Ingham and Bedale.

8. SIR BRIAN STAPLETON, KNT., b. 1379, d. 7 Aug. 1438, of Ingham and Bedale; m. **CECILY BARDOLF** (40-8), d. 29 Sept. 1432, q.v. (*CP* I, 414).

9. SIR MILES STAPLETON, d. 1466; m. **KATHERINE de la POLE** (5-10). (Generations 7 to 9: *CP* V, 397).

1. ROBERT FITZ WALTER, Leader of the Magna Charta Barons, 1215, of Woodham, d. 9 Dec. 1235, Lord of Dunmow Castle; m. Rohese.

2. SIR WALTER FITZ ROBERT, d. bef. 10 Apr. 1258, of Woodham-Walter, Burnham, Roydon, Dunmow, Henham, Wimbish, and Tey, Essex; m. **IDA de LONGESPEE** (142-2). (Mar. under question; see note c, *CP* XII (1), 111. This conflicts with *CP* XI, 382-383; note g, p. 282 and *CP* V, 472).
