GENEALOGY.

1 WILLIAM¹ ALLEN* [or ALLIN] of Salisbury, "house-carpenter," received land in S. in the "first division" and in 1640. His name appears on the list of "townsmen and commoners" in 1650, and later lists. He m. 1st, ANN² GOODALE (*Richard*¹), who d. May, 1678[S]; 2d, ab. 1684, Alice — [wid. of John Roper and of JOHN DICKISON]. He d. in S., June 18, 1686 [S]. Will, in Boston, April 16, 1674; codicil Nov. 7, 1676; proved July 22, 1686. Wid. Alice d. April 1, 1687[S]. Will of Alice Allen, of S., March 24, April 20, 1687. † Children:

- 10 IX RICHARD,² b. Nov. 8, 1655[S]; res. S. [or Hv.?]; d. June 8, 1678[S], unm. Adm. est. gr. bro. Joseph Allen, Oct., 1678; verbal will. A Richard Allin, of Hv., served in King Philip's War, under Lieut. Benj. Swett, June, 1676.
- 11 X RUTH,² b. Feb. 19, 1657-8[S]; not in will, 1674.
- 12 XI JEREMIAH,² b. Feb. 17, 1658-9[S]; m. ab. 1686[S], ANN⁸ BRADBURY, (*Wymond*,² *Thomas*¹). Living in S. in 1708. Oath al. and fid., S., Dec., 1677; freeman, 1690, in S.

* There was another William Allen who was in Salem in 1626, and had children born 1632-49; also still another made his will in Boston, Dec., 1674, without children, or perhaps only one. A Wm. Allen took oath of freemen May 18, 1631. A John Allen had children rec. at Newbury, 1656-62. Walter Allen, chil. in Newbury, 1641-47. [C Nb.]

Edward Allen, of Ipswich, mar. Sarah Kimball, Nov. 24, 1658; had children born there 1659-78; rem. to Suffield. [Savage.]

We do not know that any of these were related to the Salisbury Allens.

† Her son, Ephraim Roper, presented the account. In the will she mentioned her daughter, "Ruth hains"; grand-daughter "Sary Adhams"; "Thomas Adham's wife and Samuel Adhams my two grandchildren"; "grandson Goodhew"; "those three of my children that are deceased and left children"; "the part which should be to my daughter [Courrer's?] children, to my grand-daughter Goodhew's child which she had by John."

6 JOHN² ALLEN, Capt., (*William¹*), of Salisbury, "planter" and "vintner," b. 1648, m. Aug., 1674[S], **MARY³ PIKE** (*Robert,² John¹*) [wid. of **JEDEDIAH ANDROS**]. Oath al. and fid., Dec., 1677; freeman, 1690. Wife adm. S. chh. Jan. 29, 1687-8; d. April 28, 1695[S]. He d. Feb. 27, 1696-7[S]. Will June 30, 1691; Apr. 14, 1697. His wife's nephew, Wm. Carr, was to live with her till he was 18. John Allen's bro. Wm. Allen and Jarvis Ring were ap. adm. est. 1698.* Children :

 17 V **HANNAH³**, b. Oct. 22, 1686[S]; bp. June 10, 1688; living in 1698; prob. m. June 7, 1705[S], **THOMAS³ MORRILL** (*Jacob,² Abraham¹*).
 18 VI **ANN³**, b. Nov. 4, 1689[S]; d. ab. 1691[S].

7 WILLIAM² ALLEN, Ens., (*William¹*), of Salisbury, b. 1650, m. July 5, 1674[S], Mary Harris [dau. of John of Rowley]. Oath al. & fid. Dec., 1677; freeman 1690. Wife adm. S. chh. July 24, 1687; he adm. Feb. 5, 1698-9. He d. May 10, 1700[S]. Wid. Mary adm. est. June 3, 1700; living in 1717, settlement est., d. Jan. 23, 1720-1[S]. Children :

An "Alce Makamb" is mentioned, who apparently could not have been a daughter. Benjamin Allen and Rachel Allen were witnesses.

Savage states that *John² Roper* of Dedham came in 1637, aged 26, with wife *Alice*, 23, and two children, *Alice* and *Elizabeth*. At D. they had *Rachel*, b. 1640, d. 1641; *Hannah*, b. 1642; *Ephraim* and *Benjamin* (or *Nathaniel*), twins, b. 1645. From the will it appears that she also had a dau. *Ruth* who m. — Haynes; that a dau. m. — [Courrers?]; and that either a dau. or a granddau. m. — Goodhue. *Thomas Adams* of Charlestown m. *Alice Roper* [dau. of *John²* and *Alice*], Dec. 2, 1654. They had *Edith*, b. 1656; *Susanna*, b. 1661; *Sarah*, b. 1667; *Samuel*, b. 1669; *Abigail*, b. 1671. W. Ch. adds *Thomas*, *Rebecca*, b. 1657, and *Mary*, b. 1664, omits *Edith*, with mar. 1656.

* A John Allen served under Capt. Turner, April, 1676, King Philip's war. John Allen, of S., mariner, about to go on a voyage to sea, made his wife Mary his attorney, Sept., 1682. Lieut. John Allen was wounded by the French and Indians, July or Aug., 1691, at "Mequoit" [Pike's Journal]. John Allen was a witness in trial of *Susanna Martin*, 1692.

Maj. Robert Pike gave land in 1687 to his seven children, and in 1691 he deeded Mary's share to her husband, Lieut. John Allen.

† A Mary Allin m. **JOHN MERRILL**, both of S., Sept. 23, 1702[S]. Possibly (16) Mary, or dau. of (9) Joseph.

8 BENJAMIN² ALLEN (*William*¹), of Salisbury and Rehoboth, b. 1652; m. 1st, Sept. 3, 1686[S], Rachel —,* [wid. of HENRY³ WHEELER (*Henry*,² *John*¹)]; 2d, Nov. 13, 1695, Hopestill Leonard of Rehoboth or Taunton. Freeman 1690. Wife Rachel adm. S. chh. May 7, 1693; d. May 5, 1694. Children:
