EDWARD GILMAN, of Easton and Hingham; b. 1587; d. in Exeter, New Hampshire, 22d June, 1681; m. 3d June, 1614, in England, Mary Clark and with his wife, three sons, two daughters and three servants came to America 26th April, 1638 from Hingham, England, where his family was held in great esteem; leaving Gravesend, England on the ship Diligent of Ipswich, Capt. John Martin, and arrived at Boston, Massachusetts Bay Colony, 10th August, 1638, was admitted Free-

man 13th March, 1639; removed to Rehoboth, 1643, and to Ipswich soon after, where he was in 1647 and after 1652 to Exeter where he died. His descendants have been in civil office from the time Massachusetts became a royal province until the present time.

In 1652 was one of the Selectmen and held the office for several successive years; was lieutenant 1667; one of the members of the first Provincial Council of New Hampshire, 1680; Member of the Assembly, 1693–1697; Speaker, 1693; Judge of the Provincial Court; m. 20th June, 1657, Elizabeth Treworgye, b. 1639, d. 8th September, 1719, dau. of James and Catherine (Shapleigh) Treworgye, of Kittery, Maine.

Colonel John Gilman, II, of Exeter, New Hampshire; b. 19th June, 1677; d. 1st December, 1748. Was one of the grantees of Gilmanton and mentioned in the charter as Chairman of the first Board of Selectmen; Captain of the New Hampshire Forces, 1702; Major, 1719; was Moderator of the first of the Proprietors, 14th March, 1728; Colonel, 1737; frequently in active service against the Indians; Representative for Exeter in New Hampshire General Assembly, 1716, 1727; m. (firstly) 5th June, 1698, Elizabeth Coffin, b. 1680, d. 4th July, 1720, dau. of Peter and Abigail (Starbuck) Coffin; m. (secondly) 20th December, 1720, Elizabeth (Clark) Hale, widow of Dr. Robert Hale, and dau. of Nathaniel Clark of Newbury.

MAJOR JOHN GILMAN, of Exeter, New Hampshire; b. 25th October, 1712; Lieutenant of New Hampshire Forces, 1754; Captain in Crown Point Expedition, 1756; Major, 1757, in Colonel Meserve's Regiment, and was sent from Fort Edward to the relief of Fort William Henry, where he and his troops were surrendered to General Montcalm, upon promise of safeguard; the agreement was violated, and he narrowly escaped death at the hands of the Indians. He owned slaves and a son of one of them, was the Rev. Thomas Paul, pastor of a church of negroes in Boston from 1806 to 1831. He m. 1738, Jane Deane, b. 20th June, 1721, d. 1786, dau. of Thomas (M.D.) and Deborah (Clarke) Deane.

EMILIE OCTAVIA GILMAN, of Washington, D. C.; b. 8th January, 1853, in West Lebanon, New Hampshire; m. Capt. Otto Holstein, I, b. 1843, in Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, d. 1883, in New York City; served in the 11th Cavalry Missouri Volunteers, from the organization of the Regiment in the fall of 1863 until the close of the Civil War in 1865; he served often under the command of Col. A. B. Kaufman, U. S. Army (retired) who states, "I have always found him a courteous gentleman and a brave and efficient officer. Our service was in Arkansas embracing the territory north of the Arkansas River to the southern counties of Missouri against murderous and thieving guerrilas, a service that was accompanied by many hardships and dangers." After the war, settled in Kentucky and de-

voted himself to journalism and the breeding of fine horses; he was the son of Alexander Holstein and Julia Ann Pryor, who was b. February, 1802, d. 7th March 1898, dau. of Maj. John Pryor of Virginia, b. 6th June, 1750, d. 9th January, 1816, m. 1796, Anne Whiting, b. 1779, of Virginia.
