Irene of Hungary

Saint **Irene of Hungary** (1088 – 13 August 1134), born **Piroska**, was a Byzantine empress by marriage to John II Komnenos. She is venerated as a saint.

Life

She was a daughter of <u>Ladislaus I of Hungary</u> and <u>Adelaide of Swabia</u>. Her maternal grandparents were <u>Rudolf of Rheinfeld</u> and his second wife <u>Adelheid of Savoy</u>. Adelheid was a daughter of <u>Otto</u> of Savoy and Adelaide of Turin. She was the mother of the future emperor <u>Manuel I Komnenos</u>.

She was born in <u>Esztergom</u>. Her mother died in 1090 when Piroska was about two years old. Her father died on 29 July 1095. Ladislaus was succeeded by his nephew <u>Coloman of Hungary</u> who apparently was the new guardian of orphaned Piroska.

In an effort to improve relations with <u>Alexios I Komnenos</u> of the <u>Byzantine Empire</u>, Coloman negotiated the marriage of Piroska to <u>John II Komnenos</u>. John II was the eldest son of Alexios I and <u>Irene Doukaina</u>. He was already co-ruler of his father since 1 September 1092 and was expected to succeed him. The negotiations were successful and Piroska married John in 1104. The marriage was recorded by Joannes Zonaras and John Kinnamos.

Following her conversion to the <u>Eastern Orthodox Church</u> and settlement in <u>Constantinople</u>, Piroska was renamed Irene.

Irene played little part in government, devoting herself to piety and her many children.

Irene died on 13 August 1134 and was later venerated as Saint Irene.

Issue


She and John had eight children. The primary source about their order of births is the chronicle of Niketas Choniates:

- 1. <u>Alexios Komnenos</u> (February 1106 1142), co-emperor from 1122 to 1142. His birth is recorded in the Alexiad by Anna Komnene.
- 2. Maria Komnene (twin to Alexios), who married John Roger Dalassenos.
- 3. Andronikos Komnenos (died 1142).
- 4. Anna Komnene, married Stephen Kontostephanos.
- 5. Isaac Komnenos (died 1154).
- 6. Theodora Komnene (died 12 May 1157), who married Manuel Anemas.
- 7. Eudokia Komnene, who married Theodore Vatatzes.
- 8. Manuel I Komnenos (died 1180), emperor from 5 April 1143 24 September 1180.
