# John Grey of Groby

**Sir John Grey, of Groby**, Leicestershire (c.  $1432^{[1]} - 17$  February 1461) was a Lancastrian knight, the first husband of Elizabeth Woodville who later married King Edward IV of England, and great-great-grandfather of Lady Jane Grey.

# Titles

Grey was the son and heir of Elizabeth Ferrers, <u>6th Baroness Ferrers of Groby</u> (1419–1483) and of Sir Edward Grey (c. 1415–1457), a son of <u>Reginald Grey</u>, <u>3rd Baron Grey de Ruthyn</u>.<sup>[1][2]</sup> His father was summoned to parliament as <u>Baron Ferrers of Groby</u> in right of his wife.<sup>[1][3]</sup> After the death of Grey's father his stepfather, <u>John Bourchier</u>, assumed his wife's title, Baron Ferrers of Groby.<sup>[1]</sup>

As Grey would predecease his mother, Lady Ferrers, the title of <u>Baron Ferrers of Groby</u> would pass to his eldest son and heir, <u>Thomas</u>.<sup>[1]</sup> Grey was never summoned to Parliament. Another title, <u>Baron Grey of Groby</u> was created 21 July 1603 for his direct descendant, <u>Henry Grey (c.1547–1614)</u>.

# Wife and children


About 1454, Sir John Grey married <u>Elizabeth Woodville</u>, the eldest daughter of <u>Richard Woodville</u>, and <u>Jacquetta of Luxembourg</u>.<sup>[1]</sup> They had two sons, <u>Thomas</u>, later <u>Marquess of Dorset</u>, born in 1455, and <u>Richard</u>, born in 1457. Richard was aged about 26 when executed on the orders of Richard III in June 1483.<sup>[2]</sup>

In 1491, his widow, by then Queen Dowager, became the co-heiress of her brother, <u>Richard Woodville, 3rd Earl Rivers</u>. She died a year later. [1][3]


# Death at the battle of St Albans

Sir John Grey was killed in the <u>Second Battle of St Albans</u> in 1461, fighting for the <u>Lancastrian</u> cause.<sup>[1]</sup> His widow, Dame Elizabeth Grey, later secretly married <u>Edward IV</u> who was the successful <u>Yorkist</u> claimant to the throne.<sup>[1][2]</sup>
