

HENRY SHERBURNE, Gent., b. at Haighton, ca. 1541/2, d. 1598; m. (second) Joan, dau. of — Acton, of the City of Oxford and sister of Thomas Acton, of Oxford, a descendant of the family of Acton of Worcestershire. Henry Sherburne left Lancs. and settled at Oxford, ca. 1560 “in the Parish of St. John the Baptist over against Morton College Church in a house by him new-built, formerly called Byham (but commonly) Beam Hall”.

JOSEPH SHERBURNE, b. at Oxford, England, d. at Odiham, Hants., Eng.

HENRY SHERBURNE, bapt. at Odiham, Hants., Eng., 28 Mar. 1611, d. at Portsmouth, N.H., bef. 8 Sept. 1681; in 1640, Warden of the Church of England at Portsmouth; in 1644, Gov. Bellingham appointed him Judge at Portsmouth; in 1651, the General Court of Massachusetts appointed him Associate Judge of “Strawberry Bank”; in 1660, served as Deputy to the General Court at Boston; m. (first) 13 Nov. 1637, Rebecca Gibbons, b. prob. in England, 1620; d. in New Hampshire, 3 June 1667, dau. of Ambrose Gibbons,

CAPT. SAMUEL SHERBURNE, b. at Portsmouth, N.H., 4 Aug. 1638, killed by Indians in King William’s War, at Casco Bay, Maine, 4 Aug. 1691; m. 15 Dec. 1668, Love Hutchins, b. at Haverhill, Mass., 16 July 1647, d. at Kingston, N.H., Feb. 1739, dau. of John Hutchins of Haverhill,

MARGARET SHERBURNE, b. at Hampton, N.H., 15 Feb. 1678/9, d. in N.H., 1 July 1717; m. at Hampton, N.H., 26 Dec. 1698, Capt. Joseph Tilton, b. at Hampton, N.H., 19 Mar. 1677, d. at Kensington, N.H., 24 Oct. 1744,

SHERBURNE TILTON, b. at Hampton, N.H., 19 Nov. 1699, d. at Kensington, N.H., 11 Feb. 1784; m. 14 Apr. 1726, Ann Hilliard,

SARAH TILTON, b. at Kensington, N.H., 27 June 1743, d. at Candia, N.H. 14 Jan. 1814; m. 15 Nov. 1764, Lt. Col. Nathaniel Emerson, fought in Battle of Bennington, during the Revolution, under Col. Stark; b. at Chester, N.H., 2 May 1741, d. at Candia, N.H., 30 Mar. 1824,
