FARMINGTON, July 6.—Today was alumni day at the Normal School. BIDDEFORD, July 6.—Stephen Macdonald was waylaid on Main street last night by Charles Riley and three other roughts, knocked down and frightfully beaten. The brutes jumped upon him, kicked him in the back and knocked out his teeth. His cries attracted the police, and Riley and one other were soon captured and locked up. Macdonald being in a precarious condition his examination was postponed till tomorrow.

SKOWHEGAN, July 6.—The farm buildings of Phineas Eames of Embden, consisting of a house, shed and two barns, were destroyed by fire last night. Part of the furniture was saved.—Loss \$2000; insured for \$1200. The fire is supposed to have been incendiary.

Probable Murder at West Lebanon.

BIDDEFORD, July 6.—At West Lebanon July 4th, James Perkins and John D. Blaisdell committed a savage assault upon Stephen Dixon, and the probabilities are that the latter will die from his wounds. The assailants were arrested and brought before Justice Oakes of South Berwick, and their examination continued to Monday next, at West Lebanon, when County Attorney Lunt will personally have charge.
