

STATE NEWS.

FRANKLIN COUNTY.

The corn factory at Farmington finished canning last Thursday, and have put up about 600,000 cans. The largest quantity of corn put up in one day was 32,728 cans.

KENNEBEC COUNTY.

The monthly examination of the Insane Hospital has just been made. There are 412 patients in the institution.

PENOBSCOT COUNTY.

Wednesday morning the son of Capt. F. B. Ames of Bangor, aged 12 years, fell on the sidewalk and fractured the knee-cap.

Mr. J. P. Tacker of Bangor offers to match Billy Platter against any horse owned in this state, to trot on the Bangor Park, mile heats, best three to five in harness, for a purse of \$500.

PISCATAQUIS COUNTY.

The work of rebuilding the spool factory at Dover has progressed rather slowly for a week past, on account of delay in receiving the lumber from the mills at Oldtown. The machine shop, which will adjoin the main building on the east side, is up and is now being slated. The drying rooms are entirely independent from the large building, and in case of fire the latter building would be perfectly secure. The whole structure when completed will be much more convenient than the one burned and the working capacity as large.

WALDO COUNTY.

The deficiency in the accounts of Collector Pitcher of Belfast is \$6,207 27. His bondsmen have given notes for the amount.

Advices from Calcutta state that Capt. Daniel Panno of Stockton, master of ship Winged Hunter, died at that port recently, undoubtedly of fever, although the account doesn't state. Capt. Panno was an enterprising ship master and leaves a wife and two children.

YORK COUNTY.

The following parties have been sentenced by the S. J. Court at Alfred: Lewis Nadeaux, common seller, \$100 and costs or sixty days in jail; Albert Todd, compound larceny, two years in state prison; Joseph Costa, aggravated assault and battery, nine months in county jail; Chas. I. Plummer, compound larceny, six months in jail; John D. Blaisdell, aggravated assault, eighteen months in state prison; James Perkins, aggravated assault, eighteen months in state prison; John H. Wills, larceny, eighteen months in Auburn jail or same in state prison.
